Celebrating Canada's Official Languages Day

(These cards will need to be printed in English on one side and French on the other.)

- If not using numbers, then need the letter or symbol code to identify each.

- 1. It is possible to work for the Canadian government even if you are not bilingual. T
- 2. French has been spoken in Canada for over 450 years. T
- 3. All Francophones in Canada live in Quebec. F
- 4. Quebec is the only officially bilingual province in Canada. F
- 5. Canada's capital city is Ottawa. Ottawa is an official bilingual city. T
- 6. Canada's National Flag Day is marked on February 15th every year. T
- 7. There are 10 provinces and 3 territories. All offer second language learning programs so that Canadian youth can learn the other official language. T
- 8. O Canada, the National Anthem, was originally written in French and later translated into English. T
- 9. Nunavut and the Northwest Territories accord official language status to French, English and several indigenous languages. T
- 10. Canadian currency is printed in English only. F
- 11. Canada's Official Languages Day is celebrated on the second Thursday of September every year. T
- 12. "Canada" originally comes from a French word. F
- 13. The original inhabitants of Canada were the English. F
- 14. The Supreme Court has the duty to ensure that every judge who hears a proceeding is able to understand the official language or languages chosen by the parties, without the assistance of an interpreter. T
- 15. Almost every Canadian can carry on a conversation in French. F
- 16. The Government of Canada actively promotes both official languages in Canadian society with the *Official Languages Act*. T
- 17. As part of the *Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms*, French- or English-speaking minorities in every province and territory, have a right to primary and secondary school instruction in their first language. T
- 18. Canada, as well as the governments of Quebec, Ontario and New Brunswick, are members of the International Organisation of *La Francophonie*. T
